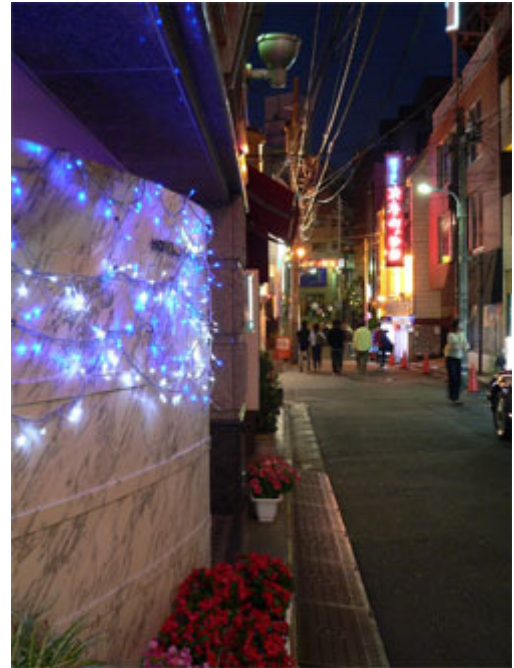

Sarah Chaplin is a new Professor in the school, and is Deputy Director of the Urban Renaissance Institute, based at the Greenwich Maritime campus. She is an architect and cultural theorist, and author of 'Visual Culture: an Introduction' (Manchester University Press, 1997), and 'Japanese Love Hotels: a cultural history' (Routledge 2007). Sarah was previously Head of the School of Architecture at Kingston University, and a Chair of the RIBA President's Medal Awards.
